


Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by Metropolitan Area, 2017

- Real GDP increased in 45 of the 55 MSAs wholly contained in this region. Growth in real GDP ranged from 11.3 percent to -5.2 percent.
- Chicago-Naperville-Elgin, IL-IN-WI—the largest metropolitan area in the region, and the 3rd largest in the nation—increased 1.5 percent due to growth in wholesale and retail trade. Detroit-Warren-Dearborn, MI—the 2nd largest metropolitan area in the region, and the 13th largest in the nation—increased 2.7 percent due to growth in durable-goods manufacturing.
- Per capita real GDP in the MSAs wholly contained in this region ranged from \$74,133 in Elkhart-Goshen, IN to \$27,352 in Bay City, MI.
