


Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by Metropolitan Area, 2017

- Real GDP increased in 23 of the 28 MSAs wholly contained in this region. Growth in real GDP ranged from 5.7 percent to -4.0 percent.
- Kansas City, MO-KS—the largest metropolitan area in the region, and the 33rd largest in the nation—increased 1.2 percent due to growth in wholesale and retail trade.
 Omaha-Council Bluffs, NE-IA—the 2nd largest metropolitan area in the region, and the 51st largest in the nation—increased 0.9 percent due to growth in wholesale and retail trade.
- Per capita real GDP in the MSAs wholly contained in this region ranged from \$75,910 in Des Moines-West Des Moines, IA to \$32,778 in Lawrence, KS.
