

Fact Sheet:
Impact of Sequestration and Reduced FY 2013 Funding on
BEA's Local Area Personal Income (LAPI) Tables

The impact of sequestration and reduced FY 2013 funding levels for the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) have required reductions in the Bureau's local area personal income (LAPI) program. Effective with the November 21, 2013 release of BEA's LAPI statistics, the following statistical detail will not be updated or made available: 1) local area employment by industry; 2) detailed statistics on personal current transfer receipts; 3) detailed statistics on farm income and expenses; and 4) statistics for "BEA Economic Areas". In addition, industry detail on compensation and earnings has been reduced from 108 industries to 25 industries.

The loss of statistical detail has a significant effect on the interactive data tables available to the public at http://www.bea.gov/iTable/index_regional.cfm. The following list provides information on the specific LAPI tables eliminated or modified by sequestration and reduced FY 2013 funding levels for all local area geographic designations. Sample LAPI tables with the reductions highlighted are also provided as an appendix.
