




VALUE OF FOREIGN INVESTMENTS IN THE UNITED STATES INCREASED AND VALUE OF U.S. INVESTMENTS ABROAD DECREASED IN 2012

Year 2012 U.S. Net International Investment Position

The U.S. net international investment position was -\$4,416.2 billion (preliminary) at the end of 2012 compared with -\$4,030.3 billion at the end of 2011 as the value of foreign investments in the United States exceeded the value of U.S. investments abroad.



- The -\$386.0 billion change in the net position from the end of 2011 to the end of 2012 reflected a \$372.3 billion decrease in the value of U.S.-owned assets abroad and a \$13.7 billion increase in the value of foreign-owned assets in the United States.
- U.S.-owned assets abroad were \$20,760.1 billion at the end of 2012 compared with \$21,132.4 billion at the end of 2011.
- Foreign-owned assets in the United States were \$25,176.3 billion at the end of 2012 compared with \$25,162.6 billion at the end of 2011.
