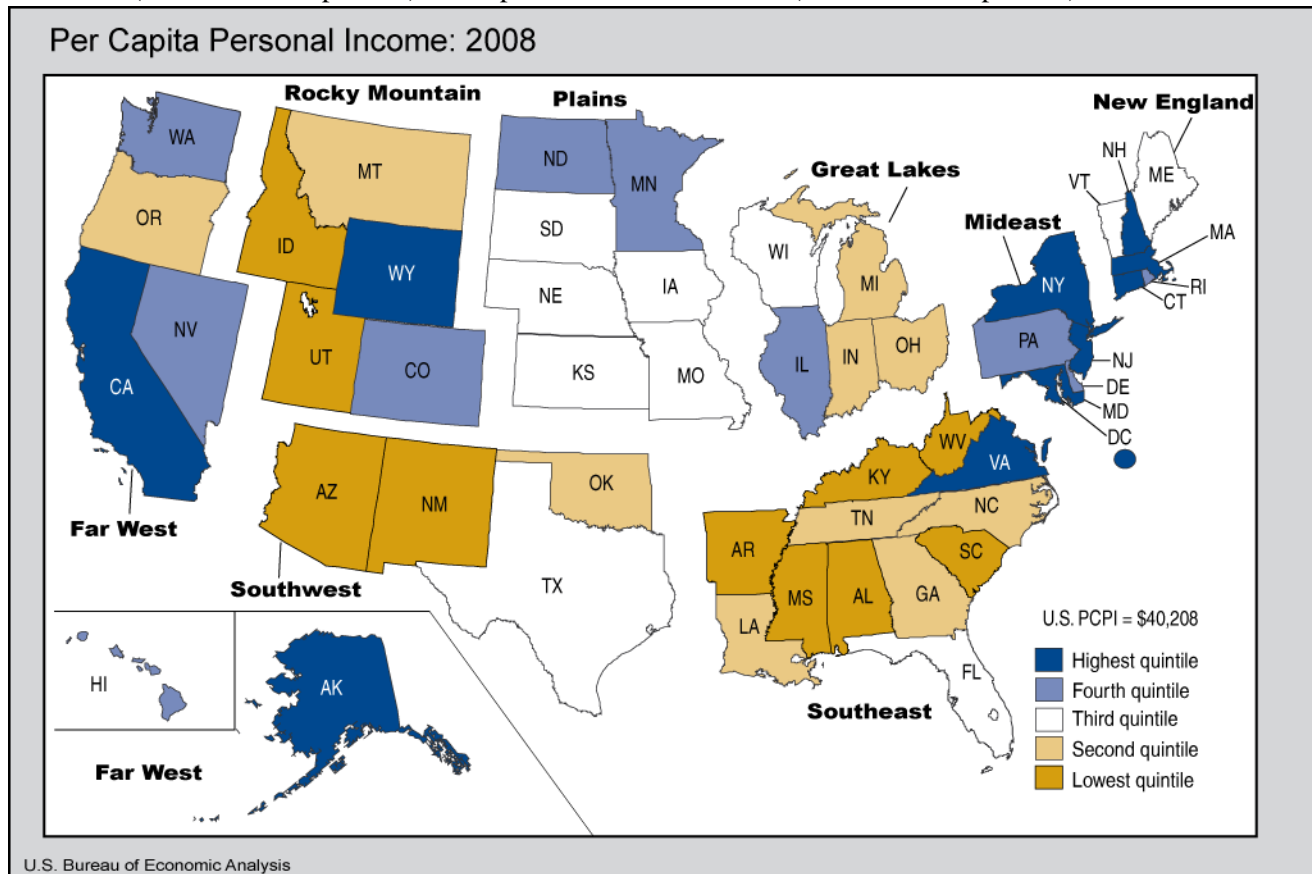


PER CAPITA INCOME IN 2008

Per capita personal income (personal income divided by population) grew 2.0 percent nationally in 2008 down from 4.5 percent in 2007. Across states, per capita personal income growth rates ranged from -0.2 percent in Arizona (down from 2.7 percent) to 8.7 percent in North Dakota (down from 9.2 percent).
